## **Progress with the Northern Upland Chain**

#### **News from Bowes Museum...**

A follow up to the two March workshops took place at the Bowes Museum, Barnard Castle on 24<sup>th</sup> April. 36 delegates representing 33 different organisations came together to:

- Hear about progress with the Local Nature Partnership to date
- Consider the opportunities that the Local Nature Partnership could deliver
- Discuss a position paper circulated prior to the meeting



#### Headline outcomes of our work to date

- There is a high level of support for the Northern Upland Chain LNP
- The partnership will need to be able to deliver clear added value
- There is a clear role to develop joint funding bids, deliver joint projects, connect things together and share best practice

#### The Utilities approach to LNPs

Senior managers from Yorkshire Water are meeting on 10<sup>th</sup> May to discuss their approach to the 9 LNPs covering their territory. Part of the discussion will focus on considering the suggestion that they nominate someone to represent the water companies on the Northern Upland Chain LNP board.

Before it was re-organised, Water UK convened an Access & Recreation Network across the industry that covered biodiversity issues. The network is still operating on an informal basis, and it is thought this could be adapted to cover LNP liaison.

#### Discussing the position paper...



Small group discussions were held to look at the opportunities and issues arising from the position paper that identified partners' thinking on the function of the LNP, along with considering possible structural options for the composition of the partnership.

### A clearer voice for the uplands

The discussion groups developed the ideas proposed to date and confirmed that the Northern Upland Chain LNP should:

- Establish a clearer voice for the uplands by developing a shared, bold, long-term vision
- Show leadership, in part through having an independent chair
- Be selective, developing a strategy to focus activity and demonstrate added value
- Develop relevant communication channels to keep everyone informed and engaged



#### Key actions and next steps

 Members of the project team will continue to talk to neighbouring LNPs, establishing contiguous boundaries and ways of working together

- We will seek partner endorsement
- A draft application will be completed and put up on our consultation page in the week beginning 14<sup>th</sup> May

#### Partner endorsement

Our application will be strengthened if it is endorsed by partner organisations. Defra will expect partners to sign up to the application, confirming their support for this response to the LNP initiative.

At the Bowes meeting we agreed that we would contact the represented organisations to seek letters of support for the Northern Upland Chain LNP as it develops its plans over the coming months.

#### **Neighbouring LNPs co-operate**

North Yorkshire and Leeds City Region LNPs are the latest of our neighbours to agree to non-overlapping boundaries and ongoing cooperation with the Northern Upland Chain.
